01 July - 12:47 a.m. - RIDE program at Bridge and Ottawa Street in Almonte - 45 cars checked - 1 traffic warning

01 July - 8:50 p.m. - on Spruce Drive - homeowner was in the basement and heard someone enter his home and observed person on the landing with jeans and an orange shirt on. Suspect fled the home. A good idea to lock the doors into your home when you are in the basement or in your backyard.

02 July - 2:40 a.m. officer located a 20 year old female throw a glass bottle against the side of the Mac's Milk. No damage to building - female warned and sent to residence

25 June 2009

1) Several large planters and garbage cans were reported tipped over on the sidewalks in downtown Almonte on the 17th of June 2009. The incidents occurred overnight.

2) A business property located on Pick Road (runs b/w County Road 29 and Ramsay Concession 8), just north of Carleton Place, reported numerous plants and pots vandalized overnight on the 17th of June 2009.

3) A residence on Jamieson Street in Almonte was reported “egged” overnight on the 22nd of June 2009.

4) Masonry tools were reported stolen from outside a business property on Queen Street where work was being conducted. The incident occurred on the 23rd of June 2009 between 9:00 a.m. and 9:15 a.m. when the tools were left unattended for a short period of time. The white 1999 Polaris 099 was stolen between 2:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on the 31st of March 2009. Due to there being no snow it is assumed the item was removed by a pickup truck etc.

The homeowner discovered pry marks at an entrance door upon having the door repaired. The exact time frame of when the incident occurred is not known however entry was not gained inside the residence.
- 2) A hay wagon was reported stolen on the 24th of March 2009 from a barn located on Blakeney Road (north of Almonte). The theft occurred within the last week. The stolen item is described as being homemade and is green in color with red rails. The wagon has a ten ton capacity and is approximately ten years old.

- 4) A property owner reported finding roofing tacks thrown on his driveway on the 08th of December 2008. The incident occurred on Wilson Street and is a repeat occurrence.

Mississippi Mills Township:

1. A residence on Ramsay Concession 7 (runs north from Carleton Place) in the vicinity of Drummond Street was reported “egged” on the 06th of December 008. The incident occurred at approximately 12:30 a.m. on the 06th.
- 2) A mailbox and several solar lights were reported vandalized overnight on the 07th of December 2008. The incident occurred at a residential property on Wolfgrove Road in the vicinity of Ramsay Concession 8, west of Almonte.

A reminder that license plates whether lost or stolen should be reported to police ASAP. A declaration form will be issued at your local detachment after a report is filed that can be taken to MTO to get replacement plates.

- 2) A vehicle was reported vandalized overnight on the 20th of September 2008. The incident occurred on Spring Street where it appears persons had walked on the vehicle damaging the roof. The vehicle was also "egged".
- 3) A dirt bike was reported stolen from a residential yard on St. James Street on the 27th of September 2008. The incident occurred overnight and the stolen item is described as a 2008 Bajaj Dirt Bug, 97cc, red in color.

1. Between the 27th and 28th of August 2008 five electric ground lights were reported vandalized (broken) and the underground electric cable pulled out of the ground. The incident occurred at a residential property on Country Street.
- 2) A vehicle was entered overnight between the 27th and 28th of August 2008 on Jamieson Street. A tire gauge, small quantity of change, and a Nokia cell phone model 6085 and charger were stolen.
- 3) The diesel fuel from a truck was reported stolen after it was discovered the gas line had been cut and the diesel fuel drained. The incident occurred between the 01st and 3rd of September 2008 at a business property on Christian Street.
- 4) Two 16 yr-old females from Almonte were arrested and charged with possession of stolen property on the 03rd of September 2008 after police received a report of two suspicious females in a parking lot in the vicinity of Farm Street at 2:30 a.m.. The charges are in relation to area car thefts and the incident is still under investigation. The suspects remain in custody pending a bail hearing on the 05th of September 2008 and further charges are pending.

There have been numerous reports of car thefts over the last several weeks in Almonte and this is a great example where someone took the time to call police and it had a positive impact. Great job!

Mississippi Mills Township:

1. A dark blue New Holland LS25 riding lawnmower was reported stolen on the 31st of August 2008. The item was stolen within the previous three days from a residential property on Ridge Road (north of Almonte, runs north off of Martin Street North to Panmure Road).
- 2) A suspicious vehicle was reported to police on the 02nd of September 2008 after several persons were observed leaving the vehicle parked on Ramsay Concession 8 (runs north from County Road 29, just east of Carleton Place) on the 01st of Sept. Police subsequently contacted the registered owner and determined it had broken down and plans had been made to have it removed. Another good example of reporting suspicious activity regardless that there was no criminal activity.
